vs
Andrew Gore Deft

The deft Andrew Gore for answer to Plffs Petition States that he admits that in the year 1914 Plff raised a crop of Tobacco on the lands of this deft under and by virtue of a contract that Plff was to furnish the land chicks implements and tools necessary for cultivation of same and the barn of this deft for housing the same and was to receive one half of proceeds when sold but denies that he agreed or at any time stipulated to pay Plff rent for his Plffs barn for housing or storing any part of same. He denies any indebtedness to in the sum of \$10 or any other sum for the use of Plffs barn. He denies that Plff ever demanded of this deft said sum or that the same is due. He denies that he is indebted to Plff in the sum of \$6.00 for patching barn roof and cleaning out and tanning the same but admits that the son of Plff did clean and patch the same which was only for 1 1/2 days and was only worth the sum of \$1.50 and 3 d for patching -

He denies that he is indebted to Plff in the sum of \$6.50 or any other sum for labor done and performed in going after roller harrow and marker and for hauling tobacco to the barn of Plff or that same was done at special instance and request of deft or that payment for same was ever demanded.
