PLFFS.

The plaintiff, Burgland, Okorn & Co.,, states that it is corporation organized and doing business under the laws of the State of Illinois with its principle place and office at Cicero, Illinois; that the defendant Goddard & Bell a firm doing business under the said name composed of Paul L. Goddard and P. E. Bell are in debt to it in the sum of \$141.37 with interest thereon from July 1st 1913, subject to credit of \$75.00 paid as of December 20th 1913; that the consideration for said sum which is due and owing is goods and merchandize sold and delivered to the said defendants by this plaintiff in the year of 1912 and itemized statement of which is attached hereto and marked "A".

It states that said goods were sold and delivered to them at their special instance and request and they promised and agreed at the time of said sale and delivery to pay therefor the sums charged. He states that said debt is due and no part of same has been paid except as has been set out.

Wherefore it prays judgment against Paul L. Goddard and P. E. Bell for the sum of \$141.37 with interest from July 1st, 1913 subject to a credit of \$75.00 paid December 20th, 1913 until paid and its costs herein expended.
