Come the parties in person and by their respective counsel, and defendant having made a written response to the rule against him to show cause why he should not be adjudged in contempt of Court for failing to comply with the order of this court, heretofore entered, requiring him to pay to the plaintiff the sum of twenty <sup>five</sup> (\$25.00) dollars per month alimony for the months of November and December, 1912, and January, 1913, and the court, having heard testimony upon the motion herein, and being advised, adjudges said response insufficient.

It is further ordered that the rule against the defendant, John I. VanArsdall, be and is made absolute.
