Chas. P. Thompson and orthers

Upon Petition.

In obedience to an order of the Mercer County Court at its May term 1913, we the undersigned Commissioners, appointed by the Court to survey and allot the lands of Sam Thompson decd., which had been surveyed and allotted as dower to his widow, E.J. Thompson, met upon the said lands on the 4th, day of June 1913, and having been first duly sworn as the law directs, we proceeded to divide the said tract of land which had been surveyed to said E.J. Thompson by the heirs of Sam Thompson decd., by deed recorded in D.B. 76 page 428, which contains an accurate description of said land. Chas. P. Thompson having purchased the interest of Mrs Samuel Cole in the said tract, with his own interest was ^{his} the owner of two-thirds thereof, and we proceeded to allot to him two thirds in value of said tract of land considering quality and quantity. We allotted to him the following boundary towit: two-thirds or forty-five acres.

Begins at a stone in Jackson Pike corner to McCrosky thence with center of pike N 85°W 7.24 chs, thence N 88° W 5.60 chains, thence S 77½° W 1.50 chains, thence S 44° W 4.08 chains, thence S 75° W 2.10 chains, thence leaving the pike S 26° W 1.88 chains to a stone corner to Thompson, thence S 54 E 31.01 chains to a stone corner to McCrosky, thence N 44½° E 16 chains to center of the pike, thence with center of same N 54° W 20.26 chains to the beginning, containing 45 acres.

To the heirs of Mrs Etta McCrosky, towit; Henry Thompson McCrosky, Fay Beckham McCrosky, and Jeanetta Lillian McCrosky, *H.N. McCrosky* we allotted the following:
