Defendant says that he is not indebted to Plaintiff in any amount.

Defendant, G.P.Chinn, denies that he was or is a partner with G.M.Chinn; Denies that that they were partners and traded as the Riverside Inn; denies that they are indebted to the Plaintiff in the sum of \$60.00 or any amount for goods, wares and merchandise, sold and delivered by the Plaintiff to the defendants at their special instance and request during the year 1924; denies that they promised to pay the prices charged therefor. ~~Denies that said prices are reasonable and that the debt is long past due and unpaid. Denies~~ that the original amount of the debt was \$62.50, Denies that G.P.Chinn paid \$2.50 on this account. Denies that he owes a balance of \$60.00 or any amount.

Defendant, G.P.Chinn, says that he paid said Ramsey Sign Service Company the sum of \$2.50; that said \$2.50 was the balance
