vs. Answer & Claim for exemptions

Charles Thomas, Dft.

The Dft., Charles Thomas, for answer and claim for exemptions herein, says that he is a resident of Mercer County, Ky., and has a wife, an invalid daughter, 18 years old, and a son, 13 years old, all dependent on his labor for their support. He says that he has no money or property other than he obtains by his daily labor, and that the only property possessed by him is such ordinary household goods as found in a family of this size, and that he has no money at all except the amount due him on the judgment obtained by him in the Police Court of Harrodsburg, against Charlie Jones and W. A. Jones, the judgment amounting to \$16.00. He therefore claims said money as exempt to him under the laws of Kentucky.

He says that R. L. Black was his attorney who brought the suit against the Jones

Black, under contract with Dft. Charles Thomas, ~~as~~ has a valid lien on the money attached in this action.
