Now comes the plaintiff and for amendment to its

original petition herein, reiterates each and every allegation

of its petition the same as if copied word for word herein and

for further amendment states that it has been informed and led

to believe and does believe and therefore avers that G. M. Chinn

was a partner in the firm operating under the name of The River-

side Inn at Munday's Landing, Kentucky.

Plaintiff further states that the defendants, G. P.

Chinn and G. M. Chinn, partners, trading as The Riverside Inn,

are indebted to it in the sum of \$60.00 for goods, wares and

merchandise, sold and delivered by the plaintiff to the defendants

at their special instance and request during the year 1924, and

upon their promise to pay the prices charged therefor; that an

itemized statement showing the nature of said goods and the prices

charged therefor is filed herewith, made a part hereof and marked

for identification as "Exhibit B"; that said prices are reasonable

and that said debt is long past due and wholly unpaid. Plaintiff

further states that the original amount of said indebtedness was

\$62.50, but that same is subject to a credit of \$2.50 paid by G.

P. Chinn dated December 7, 1926, which after being applied, leaves
