Plaintiff Union Bank says that it is a corporation duly and legally incorporated under the laws of the State of Kentucky, empowered to do a general Banking business, to contract and be contracted with to sue and be sued and that its principal office is located at Cornishville, Ky.

Plaintiff says that the defendant Royalty and Pinkston is a firm doing business under the firm name and style of Royalty and Pinkston and that said firm is composed of J.I. Pinkston and T.H. Royalty; he says that the defendant is indebted to it in the sum of \$206.97 with 6% interest ~~thereon~~ thereon from the 1st day of October, 1916 till paid, evidenced by their certain promissory note which the defendants signed, executed and delivered to the plaintiff and by the terms of which they promised and agreed to pay plaintiff the said sum of \$206.97 with interest as aforesaid from the 1st day of October, 1916 till paid; plaintiff says that said note is just due and unpaid and that no part of same has been paid except the sum of \$60.74 paid on April, 7th, 1917.

If required said note will be filed herewith as a part hereof. Wherefore plaintiff prays judgment against the said T.H. Royalty and J.I. Pinkston for the sum of \$206.97 with 6% per annum interest thereon from the 1st day of October, 1916, till paid, subject to a credit of \$60.74 paid April, 7th, 1917, for its costs herein and for whatever relief it may appear entitled to.
