The plaintiff, George Harmon, states that more than 6 months ago, J.J. Mc. Ginnis, died intestate in Mercer County, Ky; that he left a small amount of personal property and a house and lot in Nevada, Ky., which under the statute laws of Kentucky descended to the defendant, Charley Mc. Ginnis, who is his son and only heir and that there is a sufficiency of the said estate of the said J.J. Mc. Ginnis to pay off and discharge all of the debts of said decedent-

Plaintiff says that on the 22nd day of December, 1910, the said J.J. Mc. Ginnis and, whose common name was Jesse Mc. Ginnis, ~~executed-and-delivered-to~~ and Custis Mc. Ginnis, executed and delivered to this plaintiff their certain promissory note for the sum of \$116.70 with interest thereon at the rate of 6% from date and due and payable in 6 months from date. Payments on said note have been credited as follows: July 19, 1911, \$21.00; August 7, 1911, \$48.00; January 1, 1912, \$5.00; April 6, 1912, \$5.00- Leaving a balance due on said note and interest of \$90.00- Reason note is not filed- old and liable to be lost- Filed if requested. Wherefore plaintiff prays for a judgment against the plaintiff in the sum of \$90.00 with interest thereon from this date and for all relief to which plaintiff is or may appear to be entitled-
