

Warrant of Arrest.

The Commonwealth of Kentucky,

To the Sheriff, Constable, Jailer, Marshal, or Policeman in the State of Kentucky:

It appearing that there are reasonable grounds for believing that

Owen Curd

has committed the offense of

Breach of the Peace by assaulting and abusing his wife — Curd,

You are therefore commanded to arrest said *Owen Curd*
and bring *him* before me to be dealt with according to law.
