

Warrant of Arrest.

The Commonwealth of Kentucky,

To the Sheriff, Constable, Jailer, Marshal, or Policeman in the State of Kentucky:

It appearing that there are reasonable grounds for believing that
Owen Curd

..... has committed the offense of
dispoing of and selling mortgaged property, to wit, tobacco on which
at the time there was a mortgage of record in Mercer County Ky, by
removing said tobacco from the County of Mercer with intent to prevent
the enforcement of the lien thereon,

in the County of Mercer, the 6th day of Jany, 1919.

You are therefore commanded to arrest said Owen Curd
and bring him before me to be dealt with according to law.

Given under my hand as Judge of the Mercer County Court this 7th day
of Jany, 1919.
