The plaintiff, Hamilton-Brown Shoe Co., states that it is a corporation duly created and organized by law with full power to sue and be sued, contract and be contracted with and was such corporation at all times mentioned herein.

Plaintiff states that it sold and delivered to the defendant, E. R. Foster, goods, wares and merchandise, on open account, reasonably worth the sum of \$69.99, and which sum the defendant promised and agreed to pay; but plaintiff says that the same has not been paid nor has any part thereof been paid, and said sum is now just, long past due and wholly unpaid, together with interest thereon at the rate of six per cent per annum from January 1, 1927, until paid; an itemized statement will be filed herewith as part hereof, marked "A", if required.

WHEREFORE, plaintiff prays judgment against the defendant in the sum of \$69.99 with interest from January 1, 1927, until paid, for the costs of this action and all proper relief.
