Plaintiff, Cogar Grain Coal & Feed Company says that it is a corporation organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Kentucky, and has its principal place of business at Harrodsburg, Kentucky. It says that the defendant, Lewis M. Vivion is indebted to it in the amount of \$73.50, said amount being the balance due on open account; that said account is just, due and unpaid, and though demand has been made upon defendant, he has failed and refused and still fails and refuses to pay said account, or any part of same.

WHEREFORE, etc.

Plaintiff says this is an action on a contract, being a contract to pay money on account; that said account is just; that plaintiff believes it ought to recover the amount of balance of said account to wit; \$73.50; that defendant has no property in this state subject to execution, or not enough thereof to satisfy and pay said demand, and the collection of the demand will be endangered by delay in obtaining judgment and return of no property found.

WHEREFORE, plaintiff prays judgment against defendant in the sum of \$73.50, for the cost of this action, and for
