

MERCER QUARTERLY COURT.

The plaintiff J.F.Vanarsdall states that on April 12th, 1915, he recovered a judgment in the Mercer County Quarterly Court against the Defendant R.W.Tewmey for \$20.00 with interest thereon at the rate of 6 per cent per annum from said date until paid and the further sum of \$2.75 costs; that on the 22nd, day of April, 1915, he had issued from the Clerks Office of said Court an execution on said judgment for the amount thereof which execution was directed to the Sheriff of Mercer County made returnable on the 22nd, day of May, 1915 and on the 22nd, day of May, 1915 was placed in the hands of John Morgan then Sheriff of said County to do execution thereof. On the 22nd, day of May, 1915 the said Sheriff returned said execution to the office whence it issued endorsed "no property found, May 22-1915,

John Morgan, S.M.C."

A copy of said execution and return will be filed if required. No part of said judgment has been paid; plaintiff states that again on the 17th, day of August, 1915 he had issued from the office of the Clerk of the Mercer Quarterly Court an execution against the defendant R.W.Tewmey for the said sum of \$20.00 and interest as aforesaid and costs amounting to \$2.75, directed to the Sheriff of Anderson County, Kentucky; that on the 18th, day of August, 1915, the said execution was placed in the hands of D.A. Yocom, then Sheriff of said Anderson County to do execution thereon and that on the 21st, day of August, 1915, said Sheriff returned said execution to the office whence it issued with the following endorsement thereon—"The within execution was levied by me on a merry-go-round, the property of Tewmey and Burton which was appraised at \$600.00. The said Tewmey being the owner of one-half of said property. The said Tewmey & Burton together with O.N.Smith as surety executed bond to the plaintiff that said merry-go-round should be forthcoming subject to the order of the Court. The said bond and appraisement together with this execution are hereby returned to the Mercer Quarterly Court. This August 21st, 1915.
