The plaintiff, J.T.Royalty, states that the defendant Lish Preston is indebted to him in the sum of \$28.78 for goods and merchandise bought from this plaintiff and for which he agreed and promised to pay the sums opposite same on an itemized account which is filed herewith as a part hereof, marked "A" for identity. He states that said goods were bought and delivered to the Defendant at his special instance and request and for which he agreed to pay. He states that said defendant has admitted said account and promised to pay all of it within the past ~~three~~ years. He states that the nature of the claim is as above set out that it is just due and owing and that he ought to recover of the Defendant the sum of \$28.78. He states that this is an action for the recovery of money against the Defendant that he believes that defendant is above to sell, convey and otherwise dispose of his property for the purpose of cheating, hindering and delaying his creditors and that he will do so unless prevented by attachment. Wherefore he prays for a judgment against the Defendant in the sum of \$28.78 for his cost, for a general order of attachment against the property of the defendant, He prays for all general and proper relief.
