W. Tewmy and George Burton) and that the said Tewmy and Burton have executed bond to plaintiff, with the defendant ~~anonymously~~ O. N. Smith surety therein to the effect that they will have the said Merry Go-round forthcoming in obedience to any order of court in any equitable action brought on said levy, and it appearing that said bond is filed with the return of the said sheriff:

Now, on motion of the plaintiff, J. F. Vanarsdall, it is ordered that the defendants, R. W. Tewmey, George Burton and O. N. Smith produce said Merry Go-round and have the same forthcoming at or near the courthouse in Harrodsburg, Mercer county, Kentucky, on or before August 30th, 1915, for such disposition as the Court may then direct. A failure on the part of ~~any~~ the defendants to have said Merry Go-round on hand at said time and place shall be treated as contempt and the offender or offenders shall be punished accordingly:

~~Provided, however, that if settlement be made with plaintiff by the payment of his judgment, interest and costs on or before August 30th, 1915, then this order shall cease to be effective.~~
