About the hardest job a feller has in this life is to decide where economy stops and extravagance begins. Saving money is just not spending it—like not spending money to have your teeth fixed—that's keeping the money in your pocket all right, but it's a long ways from economy—it's just the reverse and twice as extravagant too.

Lots of farmers—generally pretty sensible ones too—along this time of year think they're savin' money with cheap seeds, forgetting all the time that inferior seeds are dear at any price.

The abundance of the crop grown is dependent upon the quality of the soil, weather conditions, and right number of plants to an acre—and you can't grow vigorous up and coming plants without fertile seeds.

Take corn, for instance—to produce 100 bushels to the acre you have to stalk every foot four inches in a row 3¼ feet apart, and for a good stand of Alfalfa, say Tennessee No. 76, there should be 215 plants to the square foot, and for a good stand of Kobe, 119 plants.

No use ahopin' if the plants ain't there, and no use a prayin' if the seeds won't germinate—and they won't if they are not fertile.

And there's no end of money thrown away on cheap fertilizers. Course a good season in the ground will help—but it's pretty hard to cheat fertilizers—and jest that: you're losing a lot of back breaking labor and a whole growing season besides.

## The Importance of Knowing Your Own Mind

SOME years ago the personnel director of one of the country's largest business organizations remarked that in his experience one of the rarest of human individuals is the young man about to enter business who possesses a fairly definite idea of what he wants to do and his qualifications for doing it.

To be uncertain in your own mind about what you want to do when you are applying for a job is a serious enough handicap, but the handicap is far more serious if the uncertainty continues for months or years after you have landed the job. Yet this uncertainty does continue to exist in the minds of great numbers of men and is a factor largely responsible for the lack of success of those who spend their entire lives drifting from one job to another, never earning more than a bare living in any of them.

In nearly every business the period of apprenticeship is likely to be more or less boring and is rarely highly remunerative. But this period can be invaluable to the beginner if he uses it to study the workings of the business in all its phases, and to make up his mind in which of these phases—accounting, research, selling, general administration, etc.—he is most interested and best qualified to succeed.

The business leaders of tomorrow will be the young men who today are using their apprenticeship to discover where their interests and aptitudes lie, who are developing a definite purpose to chart their careers accordingly, and who by observation, reading and study are equipping themselves to attain their goal.

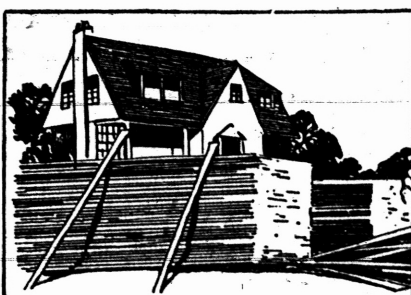

## ALLEN KING'S MIXED GROUP OF WILD ANIMALS —NATURAL ANIMALS

Lions and royal Bengal tigers are natural enemies as well as leopards, black pumas and hyenas. It requires months of unceasing patience and training so that they may become reconciled to remain in the same cage without mortal combat.

In the long history of the circus and the training of wild animals there have only been several trainers who have succeeded in working a great mixed group of Nubian lions, royal Bengal tigers, pumas, jaguars and hyenas. 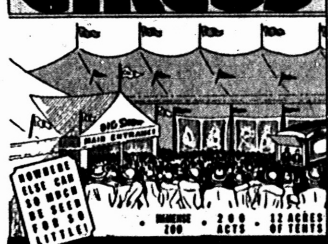
