## 2 Murders, 3 Damage Suits In Boyle County

Several Plaintiffs Sue For \$10,000  
Each; Four Persons Involved In  
Two Killings.

Three damage suits for \$10,000 each and two murder cases are among cases on the docket of Boyle Circuit Court which opened Monday with Judge Kindrick S. Alcorn on the bench.

The major damage suits filed includes Howard Hunt, seeking \$10,000 damages from R. L. Arnold as the result of an election argument; Katie Hynes seeking \$10,500 for permanent injuries and hospital costs against Fred Devine, of Perryville, received in an auto collision; and Tevis & Ingram Construction Company against the City of Danville for approximately \$10,000, representing the balance of an account alleged due.

Murder cases to be tried are: Lloyd Chambers, Jess Hilbert and Bill Curtis on murder charges in connection with the murder of Edward McDermott and the malicious cutting and wounding of his brother, Stuart McDermott.

Tom McRoberts, negro, will face the Grand Jury on a murder count as the result of the fatal stabbing of William Owsley, negro.
