Affiant Hettie B. Hanna states that she is the Plaintiff in the ^{above} styled action; that F.G. Hanna died testate in Mercer County, Ky. in December, 1916, and that under the provisions of his will, which was duly probated in the Mercer County Court, she became the owner of his entire estate, both real and personal, and ^{by} virtue thereof she is the holder and owner of the note hereto attached against the Defendant W.E. Taylor, which he executed and delivered to the said F.G. Hanna on June 28, 1916, She states that her claim against the Defendant is the note mentioned above, which is dated June 28, 1916, payable one day after said date; is for the sum of \$40.40 and bears interest, at the rate of 8 per cent per annum, from maturity until paid, no part of which has been paid. She says that her claim is just and that she believes she ought to recover of the Defendant the sum of \$40.40 and interest thereon from the 29th day of June, 1916, until paid and her cost herein expended. She says that the Defendant has no property in this state subject to execution, or not enough thereof to satisfy Plaintiff's demand, and the collection thereof will be endangered by delay in obtaining judgment, or a return of no property found. She asks judgment against the Defendant for her said debt, interest and cost, and that ~~Wacker~~ Parsons be summoned as garnishee herein. She prays for all proper relief. *Hettie B. Hanna*
