

Plaintiff says that the defendant is indebted to it in the sum of \$105.02 for goods, wares and merchandise sold and delivered to him at his special instance and request and for which he promised and agreed to pay. It says that payment has been demanded but that defendant has failed and refused to pay the same or any part thereof and that the whole of said indebtedness is now past due and owing.

Wherefore, it prays judgment in the sum of ~~\$105~~ \$105.02 against defendant with interest thereon at 6% from November 23d 1928 until paid; for its cost herein and all further relief it may appear entitled.
