The plaintiff, Meyer & Gross, states that it is a corporation duly created and existing under the laws of the State of New Jersey, with full power to contract and be contracted with and to be sued and to sue, and was such corporation at all times mentioned herein.

It states that on or about the 27th day of July, 1927, it sold and delivered to the defendant, J. S. Vaught, Jr., on open account, goods, wares and merchandise of the reasonable value of \$220.00; that the defendant promised and agreed to pay said sum but has failed and refused so to do except to pay \$40.00 on account June 26, 1929, leaving a balance of \$180.00 long past due and wholly unpaid. An itemized statement of said account and duplicate invoice are filed herewith.

WHEREFORE, plaintiff prays judgment against the defendant in the sum of \$180.00 with interest thereon from this date until paid, for the costs of this action and all proper relief.
