The plaintiff, The Meeker Company, states that it is a corporation duly created and organized under the State of Missouri, with full power to sue and be sued, contract and be contracted with, and was such a corporation at all times mentioned herein.

It states that on or about the 18th day of August, 1927, and on or about the 8th day of November, 1927, it sold and delivered to the defendant on open account, goods wares and merchandise reasonably worth \$63.17; that the defendant has promised and agreed to pay said sum but has failed and refused so to do, and that the said \$63.17 is now long past due and wholly unpaid.
