

Warrant of Arrest

The Commonwealth of Kentucky,

To the Sheriff, Constable, Jailer, Marshal or Policeman in the State of Kentucky:

It appearing that there are reasonable grounds for believing that

has committed the offense of

and bring them before me to be dealt with according to law.
