Plaintiffs Ransdell & Son, state that the defendant Effie Gilpin is indebted to them in the sum of \$9.45 for groceries furnished her at her request for which she promised to pay ; that said account is past due and unpaid.

Plaintiffs state that said account is just due and unpaid; that this is an action upon a contract being a contract to pay money for groceries furnished her at her request; that defendant has no property in this state subject to execution ^{or} not enough thereof to satisfy and pay said indebtedness and the collection of the demand will be endangered by delay in obtaining judgment and return of no property found.

Wherefore plaintiffs pray for judgment against defendant in the sum of \$9.45 for costs of this action and for a general order of attachment of defendant's property and for all other relief to which they may appear to be entitled.
