The affiant, Martha J. Murphy states that she is a housekeeper with a family residing in Mercer County Ky the family consisting of herself and one daughter 16 years of age entirely dependent upon her for a support; that she owns one horse and one cow; that she has on hand 2 barrels of corn 10 shocks of fodder and nothing else of any kind in the way of feed for said stock; that the money attached in this case is the proceeds of tobacco raised on her land in the year 1923 and that said money ~~xxxxxxx~~ and crop is all that she has with which to provide feed for said stock.

She states that the only provisions and feed stuff which she has consists of a small amount of canned fruits, the meat from two small hogs weighing not over ~~150~~ each and which meat is worth about \$15.00; that she has on hand as breadstuff not exceeding 10 pounds of flour of the value of \$1.00 and no meal.

She states that these conditions existed and were the same at the time of the levy of the attachment

She claims the corn as exempt bread-stuff and the tobacco and its proceeds exempt in lieu of feed stuff for her stock.
