The plaintiff W.D. James states that on the 25th, day of Oct, 1915 he and the defendants O.M. Veatch and Sophronie Bonta signed, executed and delivered to Z.T. Elkin their certain promissory note by the terms of which they promised and agreed six months after date to pay the said Elkin the sum of one hundred dollars with six per cent per annum interest thereon from date until paid; he says that as shown by the endorsement on the back of said note, that for value received Z.T. Elkin transferred and assigned to this plaintiff said note and that he is now the owner and holder of the same; he files said note herewith as a part hereof. He says that said note is just due and unpaid except the sum of \$60.00 which has been paid on said note. Wherefore he prays judgment against the defendants O.M. Veatch and Sophronie Bonta for the said sum of \$100.00 with interest thereon from the 25th, day of October, 1919, subject to the said credit of \$60.00, for his costs and for whatever relief he may appear entitled to.
