

Harrodsburg Men, Taken At Bataan, Are Liberated

Harrodsburg, Ky., Sept. 22 (AP) —Three additional members of the Harrodsburg tank company captured when Bataan fell to the Japs have been liberated, according to word received by their families.

Ten of the original 66 men now have been liberated since V-J Day, in addition to six freed when the Americans returned to the Philippines. Twenty-five members of the former National Guard company have been reported dead.

The latest three whose liberation has been reported are:

Capt. Edwin "Skip" Rue, formerly an aide to Brig. Gen James Weaver, freed September 8 from Camp Zentsuzi on the Island of Shikoku, according to a message received by his wife, Mrs. Frances Brown Rue. The message said Captain Rue had been returned to military status and would be home soon.

Sgt. Kenneth Hourigan, son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Hourigan, liberated September 8.

Pvt. Charles E. Reed, son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Reed, freed September 5.
