The plaintiff, L.C.Cornish and J.S.Cornish, state that they are a firm doing business under the name of L.C.Cornish & Brother. They state on the 5 day of October, 1914, these plaintiff signed a certain note payable to R.W.Keen, for the sum of \$65.00, due and payable Three months after date, and bearing interest at the rate of six per cent per annum from date until paid. They state that said note was signed by them as surety for the defendant.

They state that this is an action of Sureties against the Principal upon a note which is not yet due.

They state that the Defendant, Dud Barr is about ~~xx~~ to sell, convey and otherwise dispose of his property for the purpose of cheating, hindering and delaying his creditors. He states that unless he is prevented ~~from~~ by attachment, he will dispose of same. He states that said defendant is about to sell and otherwise dispose of his property for the purpose of avoiding paying this note above referred to.

Wherefore the Plaintiff ~~now~~ <sup>on the 23rd day of Novr, 1914</sup> prays for a judgment against the Defendant in the sum of \$65.00 and costs and for a general order of attachment against his property. They pray for all proper relief.
