

The affiant John Sneed states that Joe Lay is indebted to him in the sum of Sixteen (\$16.00) dollars, for feeding and caring for and attention to one bay horse, two years old, about 14  $\frac{1}{2}$  hands high, with left hind foot white, to the amount of \$13.00 and for feed, care and attention to one bay horse, three years old, 15 hands high, \$3.00. That the said services were rendered between the 29th day of July 1915 and the 18th day of Sept 1915; that the said two year old bay horse was and is the property of Joe Lay and is now in his possession and that he was taken from affiant's premises the 18th day of Sept, and that the three year old horse was taken from his possession on Sept 13th, but that said last named horse is the property of B. Meaux, but that the said Lay left him with affiant for care and attention, and agreed and promised to pay the bill therefor, and he now claims a lien upon the said two year old horse for all of said bill.
