

Warrant of Arrest.

The Commonwealth of Kentucky,

To the Sheriff, Constable, Jailer, Marshal, or Policeman in the State of Kentucky:

It appearing that there are reasonable grounds for believing that

Robert G. Dean

has committed the offense of
Trespassing on the premises of Louis Deshayer
by coming on said place and breaking promises
against the will of said Deshayer and handling
certain property belonging to Plaintiff Deshayer's son
in the County of Mercer, the 26 day of May, 1919.

You are therefore commanded to arrest said
and bring *him* before me to be dealt with according to law.
