The Plaintiff, The B.F. Goodrich Rubber Company, states that it is a corporation created and organized under the laws of the STATE OF MICHIGAN, and authorized by its articles of incorporation to contract and be contracted with, sue and be sued, and conduct the business of manufacturing and selling rubber goods of every description, under its corporate name, "The B.F. Goodrich Rubber Company".

Plaintiff states that the Defendant, J.C. Royalty, is indebted to it in the sum of ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN DOLLARS AND NINETY EIGHT CENTS (\$115.98) Dec. 15, 1921,

with interest thereon at the rate of 6 per centum per annum from ~~Dec. 15, 1921~~ balance due ~~for~~ goods and merchandise sold and delivered to Defendant at his special instance and request Sep. 16, 1921. It files herewith as part hereof marked "A" an account showing the character of goods so sold and delivered, the prices charged therefor, and the credits to which Defendant is entitled. It states that all of said prices are reasonable and that there is due on said account the sum of \$115.98 and interest at the rate of 6 per centum per annum from Dec. 15, 1921, until paid. It says that said account was due on Dec. 15, 1921.

Wherefore, Plaintiff prays judgment against the Defendant for the sum of ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN DOLLARS AND NINETY EIGHT CENTS (\$115.98) and interest at the rate of 6 per centum per annum from Dec. 15, 1921, until paid, and its cost herein expended. It prays for all proper relief.
