The plaintiff, The George Bohon Company, states that on the 7th day of November, 1910, the defendant Richard Shewmaker, executed and delivered to it his certain promissory note by the terms of which on the first day of November, 1911 after date he promised to pay to the order of this plaintiff the sum of \$81.00, negotiable and payable at the Mercer National Bank of Harrodsburg, Ky and bearing interest at the rate of 8 % per annum from maturity until paid. It states that said note is long since past due and no part of same has been paid, ~~xxxxxxx\$48x2x~~ ~~xxxxx~~. Said note is filed herewith as a part hereof, marked "A" for identity.

It states that said note was executed for a Hay Bailer, and by the terms of said note a lien was retained on said Bailer to secure the payment of same. It states that by reason of the terms of said note it has a valid, subsisting and superior lien on said Bailer, to secure the note, interest and cost.

Wherefore it prays for a judgment against said defendant in the sum of \$81.00 with interest from Nov 1st 1911 until paid; that it be adjudged a lien on said Hay Bailer and for an order directing a sale of same for the payment of the debts, interest and costs. It prays for its costs and all proper and equitable relief.
