SHEEP

I have so many complaints about sheep. Many people do not know much about sheep and they have trouble with them. Some say, my ewes are too fat and when the lamb comes they have no milk and live 2 or 3 days and die. What is the trouble? They are fed too much fattening food. We always fed 1/2 shorts and 1/2 brand by weight, with some oats, from 18 days to the birth and increase the food each day to 9 days after the birth and as a general thing you have enough milk to start with. Many farmers feed too much corn and oats before the birth and gets the mother too fat when the lamb comes. From a few days before the birth you should cut your roughness and the mother will be a great deal better. Please do not run your buck and bid pet ewe or your old mean ewe as they will run in between the ewes eating at the trough and strike them in the side and kill the lamb, and sometimes the mother. Above every thing do not speak loud or be rough in any way and there is another thing about sheep and cows, do not have a female dog with them. Sometimes it is all right with sheep, but it is dangerous with a bunch of cows. For grub in the nose and brain of sheep, take the sheep shears and cut the wool from above the eyes, back between the ears, down to 5 or six inches back of the ears and wash the parts good with warm water. Wipe dry and use, at breakfast, dinner, supper, for each ewe, or buck, one inch of machine oil and 2 inches of coal oil for each in one day, and the next day they are blowing the dead ones out their nose.
