The plaintiff, Cumbe Printing Company, states that it is a corporation created and organized under the laws of the State of Missouri, with principal office and place of business at St. Joseph, in Missouri, and is authorized to sue and be sued, contract and be contracted with, and to conduct generally the business of printing, lithography, etc., under and by the name, Cumbe Printing Company. The plaintiff states that the defendant, J. E. Chief, is indebted to it in the sum of One Hundred and Sixty-five Dollars, as balance on account for goods, wares and merchandise sold and delivered to and work done and performed for, the defendant by plaintiff at the said defendant's special instance and request, and for which the said plaintiff agreed and promised to pay, but that no part of said balance has ever been paid. That said sum or balance has been due since June 1, 1919, and that plaintiff ought to recover interest thereon from said time, but that no part of principal or interest has ever been paid.
