HUGH SEMONIS, WILL SEMONIS, FANNY SEMONIS, ETTA SEMONIS
AND MATILDA MC. GINNIS,

DEFS

states that

The plaintiffs, Hugh Semonis, Will Semonis, Fannie Semonis, Etta Semonis and Matilda Mc. Ginnis are children and heirs of J. H. Semonis, deceased, who died intestate in Mercer County early in the year 1917, leaving no property of any consequence except an interest in an estate by inheritance from his brother, W. H. Semonis, who died intestate a few weeks subsequent to the death of the said J. H. Semonis.

He says that the said J. H. Semonis was at the time of his death indebted to this plaintiff in the sum of \$65.00 due him for the rent of a small farm for the year 1915 and that said debt is the heritage of the defendants and that no part of same has ever been paid though payment has long past due and has been repeatedly demanded. He says that D. R. Terhune, Esq. as agent of the heirs of the said W. H. Semonis, now has in his hands funds due the defendants as heirs of J. H. Semonis. He says that this is an action for money due upon a contract and that the defendants have no property in this State subject to execution or not enough thereof to satisfy plaintiff's demands and that the collection of the said debt will be endangered by delay in obtaining judgment and a return of no property found. Wherefore plaintiff prays judgment against the defendants in the sum of \$65.00, for interest from January 1, 1915, for all costs expended in this action, for a general
