VS. Statement

Jack Taylor,

Defendant-

The plaintiff, Robert L. Black, states that the defendant Jack Taylor is indebted to him in the sum of \$19.38 for goods and merchandise sold and delivered by this plaintiff to the defendant and for which he agreed to pay the above amount. He states that the said account is due and unpaid.

He states that the nature of the claim is as above set out; that it is just, due and owing and that he ought to recover of the defendant the above sum, interest and costs.

He states that said defendant purchased the said goods at the times set out in the account which is filed herewith as part thereof, marked "D" for identity.

The plaintiff states that this is an action for the payment of money due upon contract and that the defendant has no property in the State subject to execution and not enough thereof to satisfy the plaintiff's demand, and that the collection of the demand will be endangered by delay in obtaining judgement or a return of ; "No property found." Wherefore the plaintiff prays for judgement against defendant in the sum of \$19.38 for his costs; for a general order of attachment against the property of the defendant and for all proper relief.
