The plaintiffs Horn and Cooksey state that they are a firm composed of Robert Horn and Seibert Cooksey doing a general Milling business in Cornishville, Kentucky; they say that the defendant W.H. Long is indebted to them in the sum of \$71.39 for flour which the plaintiffs furnished to the defendant at his special instance and request and for which he promised and agreed to pay plaintiffs; they say that said account is just, due and unpaid; that they have demanded payment of same from the defendant but that he has failed and refused to pay same; they say the defendant has no property in this State subject to execution or not enough thereof to satisfy plaintiffs demand and demand of defendants creditors and that the collection of their claim will be endangered by delay in obtaining judgment or a return of no property found.

Wherefore plaintiffs pray judgment against the defendant W.H. Long for the sum of ~~\$\$\$~~\$71.39 with six per cent per annum interest thereon from the first day of January, 1921, for a general order of attachment against the property of the defendant, for their costs and whatever relief they may appear entitled to.
