The defendant W. H. Long, having been duly summoned and failing to answer, it is adjudged by the Court that, the plaintiff, Cornishville Milling Co., recover of the defendant the sum of \$ 19<sup>05</sup> with 6% per annum interest thereon from the 1<sup>st</sup> day of July 1921 till paid and 9<sup>10</sup> costs herein expended; it is further adjudged that to secure said debt the plaintiff has a lien on the following personal property, Viz: 2 calves and one red cow and that so much of said property as may be necessary to satisfy said debt interest and costs be sold for that purpose and S. W. Kennedy, Sheriff of Mercer County, Kentucky, is hereby appointed as Special Commissioner of this Court to execute this judgment and he will make said sale at the Court House Door in Harrodsburg, Kentucky, on the first day of some County or Circuit Court held for Mercer County, Kentucky, at public outcry to the highest and best bidder on a credit of three months he will take from the purchaser bond with good and sufficient surety for the purchase price payable to himself and bearing six per cent interest thereon from date until paid.

Before making said sale, he will advertise the time, terms and place thereof and the sum for which it is to be made together with a description of the property to be sold by written or printed notices to be posted up, one at the Court House Door in Harrodsburg, Kentucky and three others at public places in Mercer County, Kentucky, for at least fifteen days just prior to the day of sale and he will report his actions herein to this Court.
