The plaintiff Dessie Edwards sates that she conducted and was the owner of a store at Vanarsdell, Mercer County, Kentucky, during the year, 1927, and that said store was conducted under the name of The Underselling Store"; she says that on the first day of January, 1928, the defendant John T. Burrus executed and delivered to her his certain prommissory note due and payable to said The Underselling Store wherein and whereby he promised and agreed to pay same, thirty days after date, the sum of \$99.15, with 6% per annum interest thereon from date until paid; she says that said note is just, due and unpaid and no part of same has been paid and that demand has been frequently made of the defendant for the payment of said note.

The plaintiff reaffirming the allegations of the preceeding paragraph and making them a part hereof as fully as if copied herein says that the defendant is further indebted to her in the sum of \$5.85 for goods, wares and merchandise sold and delivered to the defendant and for which he promised and agreed to pay; she says that said claim is just, due, and unpaid and that she believes she recover from the defendant said amount with interest and costs; she says that the defendant has no property in this State subject to execution or not enough thereof to satisfy the claim of defendant or demands of defendants creditors, *and that the collection of same may be unduly delayed by delay in obtaining judgment or a return of no property found* Wherefore she prays for a judgment against the defendant for the said sum of \$99.15, with 6% per annum interest thereon from the first day of January, 1928 until paid and for the further sum of \$5.85 with 6% interest thereon from the first day of January, 1928, for a general order of
