The Plff Anna Golden, states that the Defts Meyer Lantz and Clifford Hoyd are partners doing business under the name of Lantz & Boyd, and as such are engaged in the operation of a vaudeville show known as the Oriental Girl Show, being conducted at this time on the grounds of the Mercer County Fair Association in Harrodsburg. She states that on or about the 14th day of July 1914, she was employed by Defendants as a vocalist to render service in said show at a salary of \$25. per week, which Defendants agreed to pay at the end of each week's service. Plaintiffs says that in pursuance of said agreement she entered the employment of Defendants on July 20th at Mount Sterling, Kentucky, and performed the services required of her daily for the week ending July 25th, at which time she demanded the amount due her therefor, but up to this time Defendants have paid her only \$1.00 leaving a balance due her of \$24. She states ~~that~~ therefore that her claim against the Defendants is for a balance of \$24. due for services rendered at the special instance and request of the Defendants; that said claim is just and correct and she believes she ought to recover of the Defendants the sum of \$24. and her costs herein expended. She states that the Defts and each of them are non-residents of the State of Kentucky, though temporarily in Mercer County at this time in charge of the above named show. She states that the Defts have no property in this State other than the equipments belonging to said show and their personal effects
