

MERCER QUARTERLY COURT

O, A Byington,

Plff

-vs- Petition

Republican Publishing Co.

Deft

The Plff, O A Byington, states that that he is a resident of Iowa City, Iowa, and that the Boston Piano & Music Co, is a corporation organized under the laws of the said State, and authorized by its Articles to contract and be contracted with, and transact business in that and all other States in the Union, and sue and be sued in its corporate name; that the Deft Republican Publishing Co is a corporation organized under the laws of Kentucky, and authorized by its Articles to contract and be contracted with and sue and be sued in its corporate name.

He states that the Deft Republican Publishing Co, on the 27th day of Jany 1915, executed and delivered to said Boston Piano & Music Co its four promissory notes, for the sum of \$37.50 each, ~~xxx~~ which Deft promised to pay said Company ~~xxx~~ respectively 9, 10, 11 and 12 months after date, with interest thereon at the rate of 6 per cent per annum, if not paid on or before maturity, from date of execution until paid. He states that said notes matured respectively on the 27th day of October, November, and December 1915 and on the 27th day of Jany 1916, and that no part of any one of them has been paid. Plff further states that on April 15th 1915, and before maturity of said notes, the said Boston Piano & Music Co, by its written indorsement thereon, sold, transferred and assigned all of said notes to the Plff and that he is now the owner and holder thereof. Said notes are filed herewith marked E F G H for identity.

Wherefore Plff prays judgment against the Deft Republican Publishing Co, for sum of \$150. and interest thereon at rate of 6 per cent per annum from Jany 27th 1915 until paid and his cost herein expended. He prays for all proper relief.
