The Plaintiff Hettie B Hannah, states that F. G. Hannah, died in Mercer County, Ky, in December-1916, leaving a Will whereby he devised all of his estate to the Plaintiff Hettie B Hanna. She states that among his assets he left an account against the Defendant, Verner Jenkins, for \$11.05cts, which, by virtue of the said Will became the property of the Plaintiff. She states that said account is for goods and merchandise sold by the said F.G.Hanna, to the Defendant in the year -1915-1916, at his special instances and request and for which he agreed to pay the prices charged in the account filed herewith marked A, no part which has been paid although the same is long past due. The Plaintiff states that the Defendant has no property in this State subject to execution, or not enough thereof to ~~XXXXXX~~ satisfy Plaintiff's demand, and the collection thereof will be endangered by delay in obtaining judgment or a return of no property found.

She says that her claim arises from contract; that it is just and she believes that she ought to recover of the Defendant the sum of \$11.05cts and her cost herein expended. She asks for an order of attachment herein against the Defendant and that the City of Harriodsbugg, be summoned as garnishee herein.

Hettie B States that she is the Plaintiff in this action and that she believes that the statement above set forth are true.
