Another Son Held Also; Members Of Harrodsburg Guards

Private Heze Franklin Sallee's name has been added to a previously announced list of United States soldiers who are held prisoners of war by the Japanese, according to an announcement from the Department of War, dated April 3.

Mrs. Sarah Sallee, of 318 Alta avenue, mother of the young man, reports however that on February 27 she received a telegraphic announcement from Washington, D. C. containing the same news.

Mrs. Sallee was instructed to communicate with her son through "U. S. Army, Interned in Philippine Islands, In care Red Cross, Tokyo, Japan, via New York, New York." She has had no word from him.

Another son, James William Sallee, who was with his brother in the Philippines a year ago, has not been heard from since a letter dated February 10, 1942, was delivered to his mother about April 1, 1942.

The young men left for service with the National Guards of Harrodsburg, in which city the family lived until coming to Danville two years ago to make their home here.
