The plaintiff W. P. He says that the defendant has no property in this State or not enough thereof subject to execution to satisfy the claim of plaintiff and the demands of defendants creditors and that the collection of his claim will be endangered by delay in obtaining judgment or a return of no property found.

Wherefore he prays judgment against the defendant Homer Yates for the said sum of \$15.00 with interest from this date, for a general order of attachment against the property of the defendant, that the Kentucky Utilities Company be summoned as Garnishee herein, for his costs herein and for whatever relief he may appear entitled to.
