He states that defendant is indebted to him in the sum of \$105.00 as herein set out and described and that said amount is due and unpaid and that payment has been repeatedly demanded.

He states that the reason that said writing of assignment is not filed herewith is because it is in the possession of the aforesaid Master Commissioner Of The Mercer Circuit Court, E.M.Hardin.

He states that this is an action for the recovery of money due upon a contract and that the defendant has no property in this state, or not enough thereof to satisfy the plaintiff's demand, and that the collection of the demand will be endangered by delay in obtaining judgment or a return of no property found, and that he asks for a general order of attachment against the property of the defendant B.C.Allin and that the Clerk of the Mercer Circuit Court, be summoned as garnishee; also, that the Master Commissioner of said Court, E.M.Hardin, be summoned as garnishee.

He prays generally for all relief, either in law or equity, to which he, is or may appear to be entitled.
