For further reply he alleges that the note ~~given~~ filed with the said intervener's petition is the note of Miss Josephine Woods and that it was given for a buggy bought by her of the intervener, and that said intervener has a lien on said buggy to secure the payment of said note and that the payor of said note is solvent and that the said intervener can collect his claim of the payor of said note at any time he chooses so to do and that for this reason he has no right to be heard as an intervener in this case.

He further alleges that there was no consideration for the order of the said Jas. Woods to said Geo. Bohon Company and that said order for this reason is null and void and of no effect and does not constitute an equity in the fund upon which it is alleged to be drawn.

Wherefore he prays that at the said Geo. Bohon Company be by order of this court directed to enforce his lien on said buggy and that it be required to exhaust its remedy against the payor of said note and that it further be ordered and adjudged that the intervener's petition herein be dismissed at his costs and for all relief to which the plaintiff is, or may appear to be entitled.
