Hello Cpt. Peterson:-

I received your nice letter today and many thanks for checking on Whitman for me. I thought if he ever finish the book, he was going to write on war II and mostly about the Philippines (which I gave him alot of information about 192nd Tank Battalion.) I wanted to get one of his Books.

I have got 2 Books lately one on Death march: The Survival of Batasan, and one that Major Alvin C. Poweleit, M.D., U.S. Army Medical Corps. Ret. His medical corps was with us at Fort Knox, Ky back in 1940 and when we went to Louisiana maneuvers, he went along and he was with us in the Philippines and POW. The name of book. Kentucky Fighting 192nd Light H. H. F. Tank Battalion

His address. Alvin C. Poweleit, M.D. 802 Scott Street, Covington, Ky. 41011, he is charging \$12.50 for Book and postage.

I understood that Poweleit got a Senator from Washington, D.C. (which was from Ky) to get the street at Fort Knox, Ky. named after 192nd Tank Battalion, Poweleit told some one when the Street at Fort Knox dedicated on a date, but I forgot the date.

Cpt Peterson I sure don't know who would have one of the helmets as I haven't seen one since I was in the tanks in the Philippines before the Japanese taken us as POW.

When we went overseas, we didn't know the war was going to start and I had all my picture Albums with me. as I had 2 foot lockers but from the first day the Japanese hit us at Clark Field I never did see my foot locker any more. But when I come back home after discharge from the Army Feb. 5, 1947, I went down to Capt. Davis Britton home and I bought around 50.00 worth of 8x10 pictures of the 192nd Tank Bn. But Capt. Davis Britton and his wife are both dead. But he has a son lives in Harrodsburg, Ky. Robert A. Britton, 605 Greenwood Drive.

Harrodsburg, Ky. 40330. Davis Britton got out of 192nd TK. BN in Louisiana. and didn't go overseas with us. He had a brother who was in 192nd TK. BN, and was in the school at Fort Knox, Ky to make a officer. So he was left there. didn't go overseas with us, But stayed in the Army until he retired. His name and address is Claude S. Britton. 104 Kay Street. Louisville, Ky. 40342. He may know he got Davis Britton pictures.

All I have was taken before the war II and before we went overseas. mine are all in 8X10 black and white. And I don't have any negatives.

I had better sign off for this time.
