Wilson, 73, of 930 Riverside
Drive, Harrodsburg, was imprisoned for 3½ years in the
Phillippines by the Japanese and
received a Purple Heart.
He was active in numerous
veteran activities and held life
memberships in the Disabled
American Veterans, Veterans of
Foreign Wars, Bataan and Corregidor Survivors and the ExPrisoners of War Association.
He had served with the Har-

He had served with the Har-rodsburg 192 Tank Battalion, the American Legion, and the "408." an organization associated with the American Legion that originated in France during World War I.

Born March 2, 1912, near McAfee, he was the son of the late Lester and Lula Britton Wilson. He was a member of New Providence Presbyterian Church at McAfee.

Survivors include his wife. Rosalyn Adkinson Wilson; two sisters, Mrs. G.C. (Shannon) Farney of Harrodsburg and Em-ma Lou Collins of Lexington; and several nieces and nephews.
