Comes now the defendant, B.G.Hawkins, and for answer to the distress warrant obtained herein and by way of Counterclaim against the plaintiff, first: Denies that he is indebted to the plaintiff in the sum of \$40.00 or any sum or at all for keeping, grazing and caring for one bay horse belonging to defendant from ---- of September to --- day of September 1925-

Wherefore, etc-

No- 2. The defendant by way of counterclaim alleges that plaintiff did keep his horse under a verbal contract so to do in consideration of the defendant cultivating a tobacco crop on his place and as a part consideration for said cultivation of said crop he, the plaintiff, was to keep graze and care for said horse,

He says that the said Mc. Afee worked said horse two hundred days and that a reasonable compensation for the services of said horse was and is 50 cents per day making a total of \$100.00 due this defendant by plaintiff for the services of said horse.

Wherefore defendant prays for a judgment as in the first paragraph and for a judgment on his counterclaim for the sum of \$100.00 and all the costs of this action and for all relief to which he is entitled-
