Plaintiff T.S. McCrosky, states that on the 9th, day of October, 1916, he recovered a judgment in the Mercer Quarterly Court of Mercer County, Kentucky, against the defendant Henry Poulter for the sum of \$11.40 with 6% per annum interest thereon from the 20th, day of September, 1916, and \$3.60 costs in said action; that on the third day of September, 1920, he caused to be issued from the office of the Judge of said Court and execution on said judgment for the amount thereof and said costs; that the said execution was ~~issued~~ directed to the Sheriff of Mercer County, Kentucky and made returnable on the third day of October, 1920 and the same was placed in the hands of said Sheriff of said County to be properly and legally executed; plaintiff says that on the third day of September, 1920, the said Sheriff returned the same to the said office from which it issued, indorsed "No property found in Mercer County with which to satisfy this writ or any part thereof. A copy of said judgment and execution with said officers return will be filed herewith if required.

Plaintiff says that said judgment is now in full force and effect that the same has not been paid or any part thereof and that the same has not been vacated or superseded. Wherefore plaintiff prays for a general order of attachment against the defendants property; that the defendant be required to answer and discover any property, money, choses in action, legal or equitable interest or other property owned by or which he has an interest in, and that so much of ~~the~~ ^{said} property discovered by the defendant, as may be necessary be subjected to the plaintiffs judgment and costs of this action and asks that Noland Wilson be summoned as Garnishee herein and for all proper relief.
